Agreement Between Nouns, Pronouns and Verbs

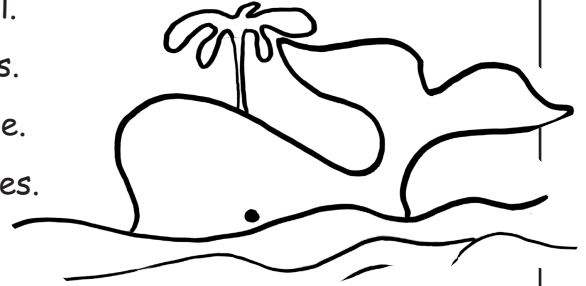
When you are writing a sentence **all the words must agree**.

A **singular noun** (or **singular pronoun**) must have a **singular verb**. For example: The dog wags its tail. A **plural noun** (or **plural pronoun**) must have a **plural verb**. For example: The dogs wag their tails.
