Starting school is a big step for both you and your child. At St Adrian's we work hard to ensure that your child settles quickly into school life and has a happy start to their education.

We value a good relationship with you, the parents, carers and families, as this plays a fundamental part in the settling in process, and indeed in the rest of your child's time at school. Your child's education is a two way process, between home and school and, therefore, you are always welcome to discuss any comments, questions or suggestions that you may wish to share with us.

In Nursery class, the Class Teacher is your child's key worker.

We aim to promote equal opportunities in all aspects of school life and to promote the welfare of all pupils and their academic achievement, irrespective of age, gender, ethnicity or disability.

St. Adrian's Catholic Primary School has a home school agreement that seeks to develop a positive partnership between the school, the family and the child. We hope that you will share this with your son or daughter and support the principles behind it.





School Times

Below is a sample timetable, although timings are approximate and vary depending upon the needs of the children. Children are also involved in collective worship, either in the hall or classroom.



Home time on a Friday afternoon is at 1:30pm.

Nursery Uniform and Dress Code please ensure that all items are labelled clearly

Boys and Girls Royal blue sweater with school crest White polo shirt with school crest

Navy blue jogging trousers (winter) Navy blue shorts (summer)

Mid blue checked summer dresses can be worn in summer if preferred

Warm weather - St. Adrian's sunhat (order through school Gateway payment system) and sun cream applied prior to arriving at school. Cold weather – hats and gloves

Please provide named wellington boots that can be kept in class so that the children can play outside in all weathers!

Waterproof coat to be brought into school every day – even during the summer to avoid being caught out by sudden showery rain.

Please provide sensible footwear to play both indoors and out whatever the weather! No laces please.

School book bags, sunhats and gym bags are available from the school these can be purchased for £3.50 each via the Gateway payment page

All about the Nursery Class

Drinks and Snacks

Please send your child into school every day with a clearly labelled drink bottle containing water. Children have a mid-morning snack time and are encouraged to try different healthy snacks. Milk and fruit are provided. We ask for a voluntary contribution of £4.00 per half term to help pay towards additional snacks and resources. This contribution can be made via the school Gateway payment page.

Book Bags

Please send your child into school with their St. Adrian's blue book bag every day (available through the school Gateway payment page).

Library Books

Every Thursday children will choose a book from our library which they can take home and share with you. Library books will be changed in class on Thursdays.

Shoes and Coats

Children are encouraged to put on their coats by themselves, so please help your child to do this independently at home. Sensible shoes with Velcro no laces.

PE Day

Nursery children visit the hall for PE once a week.

Toilet Training

Children **must** be fully toilet trained in order to start in the Nursery class. We do not have the facilities to change nappies in the Foundation Stage. Please make sure that they can also clean themselves afterwards. Do not be concerned if an 'accident' happens at school.

Spare Clothes

Please provide a spare change of clothes that can be left on your child's peg. Feel free to discuss any issues about toilet training with the Nursery staff.

Please provide named **wellington boots** that can be kept in class so that the children can play outside in all weathers!

Keeping your child safe at St. Adrian's

Punctuality

Lateness should be avoided at all times both at the start and the end of the school day. Between 8.45 and 9.00 am important learning activities take place which support your child's learning and development. Classroom doors will be closed at 9:00am and classroom practitioners are asked not to open the door after this time for reasons of safety. Should you arrive after 9:00am, please report to the School Office to register your child.

If your child is going home with another adult, please inform a member of the Foundation staff or our Office Manager. If at all possible, introduce the alternative adult to us. We will not be able to hand your child over to an unknown adult.

Absences

If your child is ill or is unable to attend school, please let the School Office know the reason for absence via a telephone message. The school telephone number is: Tel: +44 (0)1727 852687.

Taking care: Medical issues

If a child is taken ill at school, parents are notified so that their child can be collected from school. *Please let us know immediately if your emergency contact numbers or personal phone numbers change.*

Allergies

If your child has any medical conditions, including allergies, asthma or eczema, please complete a medical form, this should be returned to the School Office. You can find the medical form on our school website under Parent Information/New Entrant documents.

Medication

If your child requires any medication, such as asthma or Epipen, send it into school in a plastic container, clearly labelled with your child's name and list of contents. Please keep a note of the 'use by date' at home. It is your responsibility to replace medication as required. Please ensure that you have completed a medical form that indicates when and how the medication should be administered. Again, the form is available on our website under Parent Information/New Entrant documents.

Sickness and Diarrhoea

After being sick or suffering from diarrhoea, children must be kept at home until a full 48 hours has passed since the last bout.

Hair and Head lice

If your child has shoulder length hair, it must be tied back at all times as this minimises the spread of head lice. Head lice are a nuisance that affect all schools. Please inspect your child's hair for head lice each week. Do not send your child to school with live head lice, treat the hair and bring your child into school as soon as you have done this. Following this, continue to check your child's hair and use a head lice comb to minimise any recurrence.

Sun Protection

Children need to wear a school sunhat and come to school wearing the necessary sun protection on hot days. Reception children may bring in a named spray/roll-on bottle of sunscreen that they know how to apply themselves. However, we will assist your child.

Suitable clothing

Whatever the weather, to ensure that your child can always enjoy the outside environment, please send your child into school with a coat every day; a light raincoat in the summer and a very well insulated coat, with a hood, for the winter.

Additional Educational needs

The school is wholly inclusive and upholds parents' right for their child to be educated in a mainstream school.

The parent, classroom practitioners or a health professional may identify children with additional needs in a variety of ways, before the child starts school, or whilst the child is at school.

Any additional needs your child may have will first be discussed with you and the appropriate support will be put in place.

Some children need extra help for a short time: others may need a long-term programme of support. For minor learning challenges, early years practitioners in school provide additional support in classrooms and, when appropriate, take small groups to work on a planned programme of activities. The support of parents at this time is invaluable.

Children with additional needs may be given a Learning Plan which sets out the steps they will follow in order to achieve their learning targets. Learning Plans are reviewed each term, discussed and agreed with parents.

For any child with an Education, Health, Care Plan of additional needs, review meetings to discuss progress and provision will be held between school staff, parents and any other external professionals involved with the child.

Additional needs are not just about children experiencing difficulties - more able children are identified and appropriately challenging activities are provided to ensure they reach their full potential.

Additional Information

Special items from home

Children are not encouraged to bring in toys from home as lost or broken items can be distressing. However, children are welcome to bring into school items that are connected to the current topic or are of interest in respect of learning. Please discuss with your child what they are bringing in as this will help them to talk about it when sharing their item with the class.

Walk to School

Children are encouraged to walk, scoot or bike to school if possible. If a bike or scooter is brought to school, they should be taken home again when your child is dropped off or stored at the bike rack, in the main car park.
