SATS RESULTS

KS2 SAT Results Summer 2022

2019 data Shown in red

Standardised scores are from 80-120. A score of 100 = age related. 100 Standardised score is based on a raw score.

For Reading this was: 29/50 28/50

For Grammar and spelling this was: 35/70

36/70

For Mathematics this was: 58/110 58/110

A standardised score greater than 110 is considered to be equivalent of working at greater depth or mastery.

Ofsted Expectations - Section 5

- Much more child focussed 70% time spent speaking with the children
- More emphasis on middle leaders
- Checking to see if the intent, implementation and impact of the curriculum is happening
- Safeguarding is key
- Not all about results Ofsted don't look for internal data /
 External data and make judgements but should see children
 making progress in lessons and in books and dialogue through
 effective teacher questioning and support.

WHAT WAS DEEMED OUTSTANDING IS NO LONGER

84 per cent of 'outstanding' primaries downgraded

FFT Education Datalab analysis of Ofsted's monthly management information found that 57 of the 68 'outstanding' primary schools (84 per cent) inspected during the autumn 2021 term were downgraded. (EXCERPT FROM SCHOOLS WEEK)

There has been a very high rate of staff turn over in the school the last few years, the KS1 especially. What are you doing as a school to support the teachers in their role and in turn to provide a more stable environment for the students?

The building fund is no longer promoted to new parents in the way it was in the past. This has caused a concern that parents with older children are subsidising newer intakes. What steps are being taken the promote the building fund?

Strategic Plan Goal 3: Behaviour and attitudes - I have read the school policy and would like clarification as to how Behaviour letters are issued? Is there a process before issuing? ie. discussion with parent/teacher etc. Is the child given any warnings?

Split classes were a feature that was sold to parents as a benefit of joining the school. These are no longer a feature. I would like to understand how these were originally funded and why this no longer an option?
