# Parking at drop off and pick up

It has been brought to our attention on several occasions that local residents are growing increasingly annoyed by people parking over their drives at drop off and pick up. Please can I ask that you are

considerate of our neighbours as they too may be in a rush to get to work and are unable to do so if cars are blocking their drives. Thank you.

### **Transitions and handovers**

On Thursday 13th July, your child will spend time with their new class teacher in preparation for the next academic year. Classteachers will remain in the same classes for the next academic year. Teaching assistants outside of EYFS, will be allocated according to where the needs are across the school. These will be finalised in due course.

On transition day, we would like the children to line up where their new classroom would be in the morning so they get used to going to a new playground / new class. The children will then spend up until lunchtime getting to know their way around their new room and finding out the expectations of their new class as well as getting to know their teacher and perhaps exploring new playgrounds. They will then return to their original class just before lunchtime. Mrs Hart will organise further transition meetings with those children who require extra support and the teachers will all have a thorough handover to their new class teacher, as well as extra visits and time together with their teacher, for those children who require it.

For secondary transitions, Mr Hayes and Mrs Hart have already begun meeting with heads of years and spoken with SENCOs to ensure that our current Year 6 are well supported in their move to secondary school. We have also ordered some transition activity booklets for the children to work through in their final weeks here. I am sure all will be a great success and the children will be well prepared for the new academic year.



#### Sunscreen and sun hats

The weather is heating up, so please can we remind you to apply sunscreen to the children before school, provide them with a water bottle and they should also have a school hat. These can be purchased from

the school office. If they do bring sunscreen in, it must be a roll on (not spray), labelled and must not be shared with another child. They must also be able to apply it themselves.

During very hot periods, we will ensure the children get enough shade at lunchtimes. As mentioned in previous communication, the children can wear white polo shirts rather than a shirt and tie.

#### Dogs on site

Whilst I understand that parents and children enjoy having their dogs come with them to school, Hertfordshire's general policy is that there should be no dogs on site. I appreciate that some families have small puppies and on occasion, carry them in. Ultimately, I would prefer for hygiene and allergy reasons, as well as for the safety of all the children in the school, that there were no dogs at all brought on site carried or not. They may be tied up outside school, well enough away from the gates, it would however, be preferable for alternative arrangements to be made.
