

THE MONTH OF November

The Catholic Church has a rich history and tradition of devotions. Many are associated with times of the year, such as praying for those who have died in the month of November.

The Catholic Church designates November as a special month, to pray for and remember those who have died. Our thoughts turn to a time or reflection and remembrance. The month begins with the feast of All Saints Day on November 1st and the feast of the Holy Souls celebrated on November 2nd.

On 1st November, we celebrate the Feast of All Saints, a day when we come together in a special Mass to honour and pray for all the saints in heaven. Saints are people who devoted their lives to loving God and serving others. They remind us of the goodness we can aspire to in our own lives.

The Feast of the Holy Souls also known as the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed is celebrated on November 2nd. This is a day set apart for honouring all who have died. We are called to pray for those we have known and loved but to also remember those who may have died alone, with no one to pray for them.

We also held a special remembrance service in school to mark Remembrance Sunday. This is led by our Caritas Ambassadors.

The Feast of Christ the King is a special day for Catholics which we celebrate on the last Sunday of the church year, which this year is November 24th. King, Pope Pius XI created this special feast day in 1925. On this day, we remember that Jesus is our King, the "King of Kings," who loves and cares for us all. This feast was started by the Catholic Church to remind us to keep Jesus at the centre of our lives. By celebrating this feast, we show that Jesus is our leader and guide, we honour him by trying to live our lives as he taught us, with love, kindness, and respect for others.
