SANDY WARD - Memories from Mr Hayes

This week, we heard the sad news that Sandy Ward has passed.

Sandy drove generations of St Adrian's children on their Year Six trip to the Isle of Wight, over more than thirty years.

Even after his retirement and move to County Durham, Sandy kept up his coach licence and drove down each year especially for our Isle of Wight trip. But Sandy was more than our driver: nothing was too much trouble for him; he would do a good turn for anyone and would use his considerable charm and connections to make every trip a success.

For the children, Sandy was much loved for his larger-than-life personality and the risqué songs with which he kept them entertained. He would insist on serving the children their breakfast and his 'Sandy Special' - a mix of every cereal, to overflowing - was legendary. He was never short of an anecdote and had everyone laughing morning, noon and night.

I have many very happy memories of the trips where I was lucky enough to go with Sandy: he got the best out of everyone and enjoyed the 'in-between' role he had as our driver. He could get away with pouring water over a noisy child's head at dinner and equally, the children were happy to get their own back by throwing him in the pool. He was certainly one-of-a-kind and, for generations of St Adrian's children, he simply was their Isle of Wight trip.
