Eternal rest, grant unto him O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace. Amen.


May his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen.

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### Remembering Pope Francis

When we returned to school on Wednesday 23rd April 2025, we held a special service to remember Pope Francis after his passing on Easter Monday 21st April 2025.

The children all listened and prayed very reverently as we learnt about the life of Pope Francis and all his great achievements.



### Pope Francis' Legacy

Pope Francis has left a great legacy after his death. He was one of the more humble popes, wishing to show servitude by following in the footsteps his chosen saint name - St Francis of Assisi. He chose humility and poverty over luxury and fame. He refused to live in the grand apostolic palaces in the Vatican City, opting for a more humble abode nearby. In his first appearance as pope, he wore a simple white cassock rather than the lavish robes of some of his predecessors.

Pope Francis worked tirelessly for peace in the world. As well as advocating for the needy and for migrants. He also made it his mission to show us the importance of caring for the earth. He wrote an encyclical called 'Laudato Si' which explained that we are 'one family with a common home.' Reminding us, that it is our duty to be stewards of the earth and to care for it.

He told us 'to live wisely, think deeply and love generously'. We have a mission to be pilgrims of hope this year and onwards, to honour his life's work.



As a whole school community, we joined together to learn about the life of Pope Francis and what he had achieved in his lifetime. The children also learnt about his coat of arms and following his death, how a new pope will be elected.

We watched this video clip and prayed that he may rest with the Lord in peace in heaven.

The children also did some work in their classes and wrote some prayers remembering the special role Pope Francis played as the head of the Catholic Church.

Pope Francis' Five Finger Prayer

> The next finger is the index. Pray for those who teach you, instruct you, and heal you. They need the support and wisdom to show direction to others. Always keep them in your prayers.


The thumb is the closest finger to you, so start praying for those who are closest to you. They are the persons easiest to remember. To pray for our dear ones is a "Sweet Obligation." The center finger is the tallest. It reminds us of our leaders, the governors, and those who have authority. They need God's guidance.

The fourth finger is the ring finger. Even though it may surprise you, it is our weakest finger. It should remind us to pray for the weakest, the sick, or those plagued by problems. They need your prayers.

> And finally we have our smallest finger, the pinkie. Your pinkie should remind you to pray for yourself. When you are done praying for the other four groups, you will be able to see your own needs in the proper perspective and be able to pray for yourself in a better way.

I will be like Pope Francis if I make the right choices.


I will be like Pope Francis when I read the Bible and pray every morning and at night.

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
## Year 3– St Peter

Pope Francis - Requiescat in Pace.


